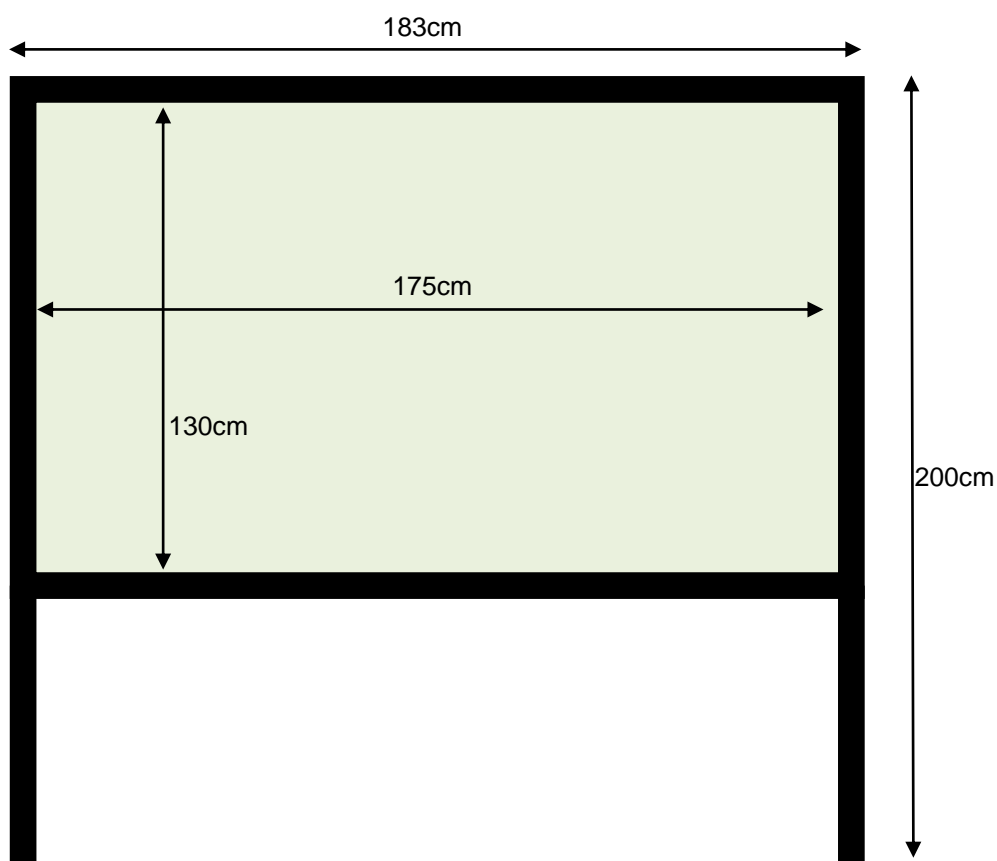

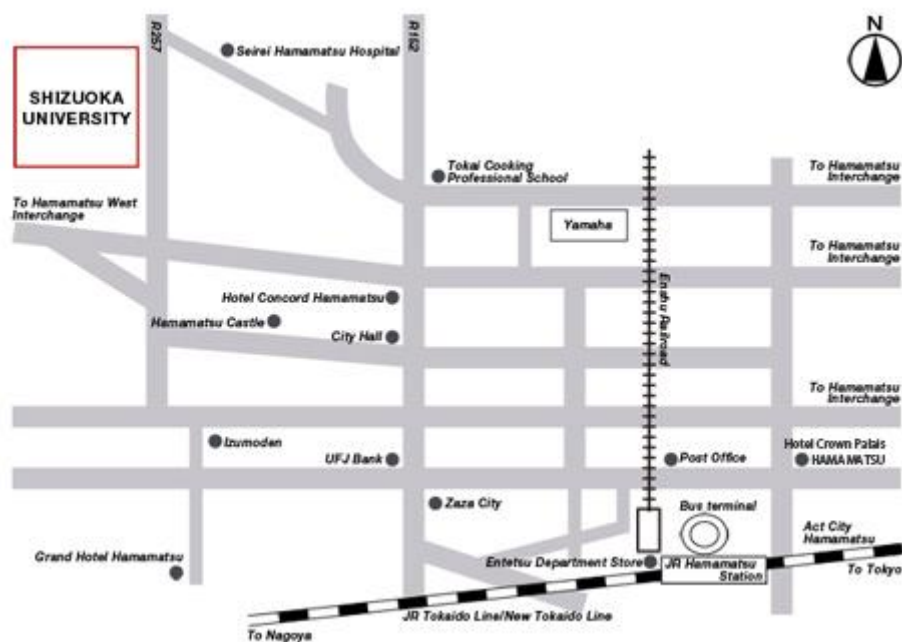
- The size of panel for each poster is 183cm (W) x 200cm (H), in which the area for putting poster is 175cm (W) x 130cm (H). (See below)

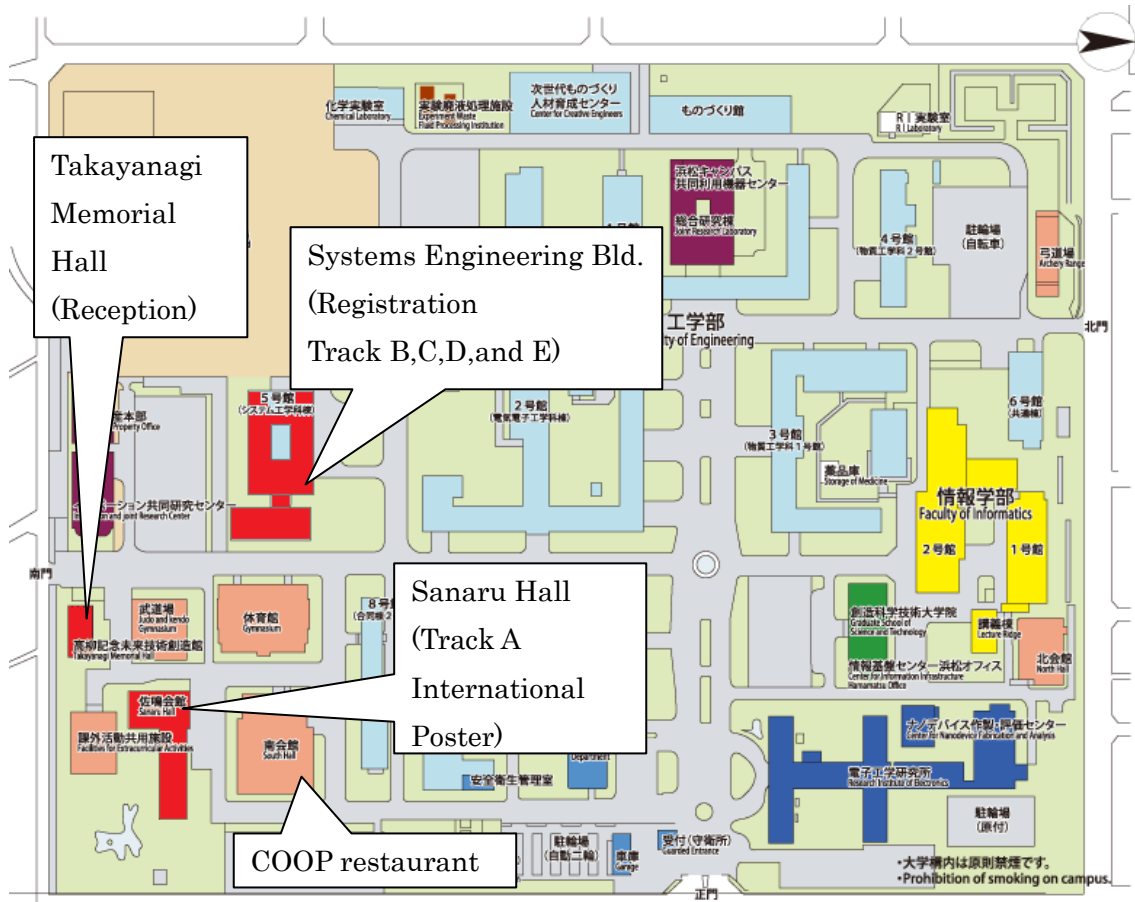
Get off at Hamamatsu station, JR Tokai line.

Board any bus from Bus Stop No. 15 or 16, North Exit Bus Terminal, JR Tokai Hamamatsu Station.

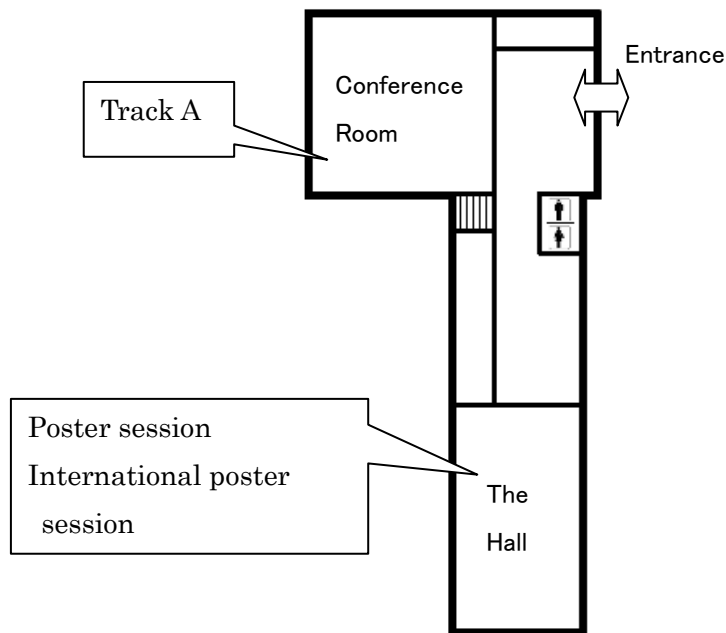
Get off at Shizuoka Daigaku Bus Stop.

Campus Map

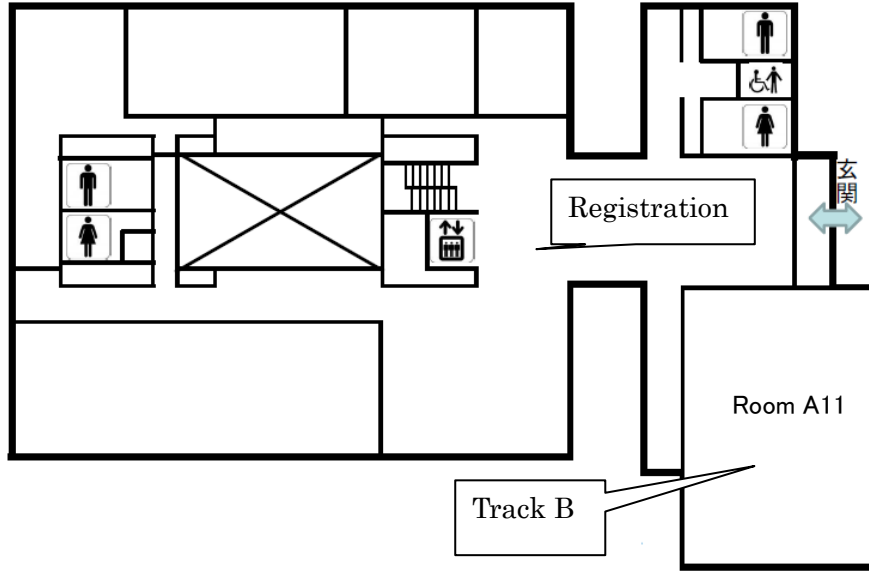


Sanaru Hall (Track A, Poster, and International Poster)

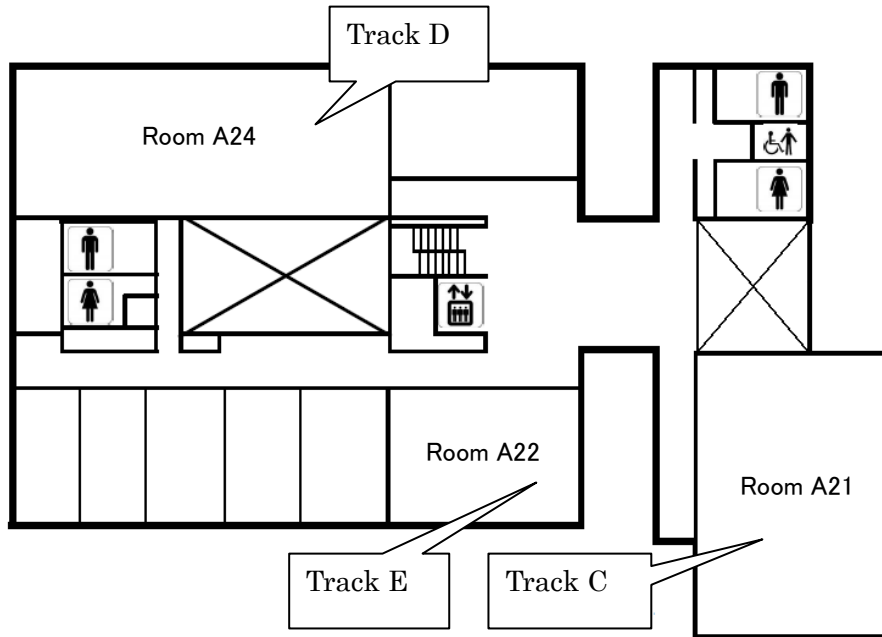


Systems Engineering Building (Registration , Track B,C,D, and E)

Aim

This symposium aims to share knowledge and experiences about risks common in Asia-Pacific area. We have common risks such as natural hazards, e.g., earthquake, tsunami, typhoon, and drought, food safety problems emerged in food trade, and environmental contamination by persistent chemicals. Moreover most of them have common cross-border nature. To cope with them, risk analysts in the area should share knowledge and experiences between them. In 2012 the World Congress on Risk will be held at Sydney, Australia. It is expected that discussion in the symposium will be developed in WCR 2012.
